



## Tuition and Scholarship FAQ



### School Day Changes

- **Q:** Does my child need to leave school at 3 pm now that the last hour is aftercare?  
**A:** No. The last hour of the day will enhance the school experience and offer value to the student's day. Attendance is strongly encouraged for all students.
- **Q:** If I am not eligible for CCW coverage, will my K-8 child's aftercare be an additional charge?  
**A:** Yes, without CCIS coverage, there is an additional charge for aftercare. However, if you are truly unable to qualify for CCW, aftercare costs for K-8 will be incorporated into your scholarship calculation. (Aftercare for Threes and PreK will continue to be excluded from the scholarship calculation.)
- **Q:** If my child rides the bus, will they be able to ride the bus home at 4 pm?  
**A:** Yes. We provide the transportation office with the pickup times and will continue to have the bus pick up children at 4 pm.

### Scholarship Changes

- **Q:** Why are there no scholarships for children in Infants through Twos but there are for Threes and PreK?  
**A:** After a multi-year pilot program, Yeshiva cannot afford to continue subsidizing the tuition of Infants through Twos, especially as there are no additional sources of funding available for scholarships in that age group. Children in Threes and PreK can receive Pre-K EITC funding, which helps Yeshiva subsidize the scholarships offered to that age group.
- **Q:** If I am paying full tuition for my TELC child in Infants through Twos, will that be deducted from my AGI?  
**A:** Yes, your full tuition charge will be one of the deductions applied to your AGI to generate your AFI (adjusted family income). Aftercare, student fees, and CCW copays will not be deducted from your AGI.
- **Q:** If my elementary school child gets CCW funding, will my tuition bill be lowered?  
**A:** No. CCW funding in K-8 is applied as part of the scholarship process and will not lower a family's post-scholarship tuition bill. It is an important source of funding that will allow Yeshiva to sustain its generous scholarship program.
